### LIGHTS OUT FOR SEA TURTLES!!!

Loggerhead Sea Turtles, the state reptile of South Carolina, nest on Hunting Island from May until August. Hatchlings will emerge in late summer and are observed well into September. The mother turtles are frightened by light, and hatchlings may become disoriented by light. **No lights are allowed on the beach at night from May until the end of hatching.**



Do not approach within 100 feet of a sea turtle; they are very easily frightened away and prevented from nesting. Such actions are considered harassing an endangered species and **are against the law!!!**

## Campground Rules and Regulations

1. Campers are allowed a maximum of one trailer/RV and one tent OR two tents per site. No more than six (6) persons (or one family) may occupy the same site.
2. 1 RV/Trailer, 2 vehicles and 1 boat trailer per site.
3. Some designated tent sites are limited to one tent.
4. Two sites designated for use by disabled persons are available.
5. Camping check-in is 2 p.m.; **Check-out is 12 noon.**
6. Quiet hours are 10 p.m.-7 a.m.
7. Maximum length-of-stay on a particular site during periods of high demand is 14 nights. Longer stays are allowed during periods of less demand.
8. Camping parties may not register for more than 42 nights of any 49 consecutive night period (no more than 28 nights out of 60 consecutive night period at parks located on US Army Corp of Engineer properties).
9. **Alcoholic beverages are prohibited.**
10. **Pets must be on a leash** (not longer than six feet) at all times. **Clean up after pets.** Owners will be asked to remove noisy or dangerous pets or pets that threaten or harass wildlife. **Pets are not allowed in cabin areas or restrooms.**
11. **It is unlawful to dispose of any waste (including gray water) in places or receptacles other than those specifically designed for that purpose.**
12. All fires must be confined to designated grills.
13. It is unlawful to cut, damage or remove plants, shrubs or trees.
14. **Possession of firearms is prohibited** except by certified park rangers and other authorized personnel.
15. It is unlawful to possess or discharge fireworks or other explosives.
16. Only licensed vehicles may be operated in a state park and must remain in areas specifically intended for vehicular traffic. Golf carts must display a valid permit at all times.
17. Cancellations and changes are subject to fees based on the notice given. Early departures are subject to cancellation policies. Transaction fees and taxes are non-refundable.
18. **Registered campers may not change sites without permission from park staff.**
19. **South Carolina senior citizens** (age 65 and older) and disabled residents may register for a campsite at a reduced rate. The qualifying individual must be present for the duration of the stay.
20. **Visitors not registered for an overnight stay are required to pay the admission fee.**
21. Roadside parking is prohibited. Do not park on unoccupied sites.
22. Bicyclists & golf carts must always ride with the flow of traffic and **may not ride after dark** on park roads.
